# Towards a Safer Shetland

### It Happens Here

Last month, inspired by the #MeToo stories being shared on social media across the country, I decided I wanted to show that sexual harassment is as much of a problem in Shetland as it is anywhere else.

Just because we live in a peerie rural community does not mean that we are safe from these kinds of behaviour.

As a volunteer with **BEE** (**Bold, Equal & Empowered**), **Shetland Rape Crisis'** young activists group, I know that breaking the silence around sexual violence is an important part of preventing it and also helping victim-survivors to know they are not alone and that they can heal from it.

# Asking The Question

I used an anonymous social media app to ask the question: have you been affected by sexual harassment in Shetland? I made it clear that responses would be anonymous and used for a thread on my social media to show how much of a problem this is.

I expected a lot of responses, but I was shocked by the sheer amount that came in and the seriousness of the incidents described.

As well as stories of sexual harassment, I received stories of sexual coercion, assault, abuse and rape - a lot of which had occurred against children and young people.

I decided to share everything that was sent to me out of respect for the survivor's stories and recognition that sexual harassment is just one part of a set of a wider set of cultural values that enable behaviours like assault, abuse and rape. Shetland Rape Crisis helped me to further anonymise these stories before sharing.



## What Is Sexual Violence?

Sexual violence/violation is any form of sexual contact that you don't freely agree to.

Contact includes more than just physical touch, it also includes any sexualised interaction you don't want such as harassment, unwanted messages, stalking, inappropriate comments, sharing intimate images, and more.

It also includes physical contact such as groping, taking advantage of someone on alcohol or drugs, coercing or pressuring someone into sexual acts, removing condoms without agreement, sexual assault, and rape.

Sexual violence is common. Anyone can experience it, at any age. Many survivors never tell anyone and it is rarely reported to the police.

The victim is not to blame. Sexual violence doesn't 'just happen'. A person commits sexual violence because, at some level, they decide to do so.



### **A Personal Note**

I would like to thank everyone who shared their story with me. I am grateful for your bravery and your trust. I have done my best to make sure your words are reflected here, while keeping your identity as safe as possible.

Receiving these stories has been a very powerful but also very overwhelming experience for me. Although I am always happy to support friends and I feel passionate about creating an equal world free from sexual violence, I am still a young person myself and not a trained counsellor.

For this reason, I am asking that if you read this and want to share your story, instead of sending it to me please contact Shetland Rape Crisis or another appropriate organisation or person and they will help you with it.





I was 8 and I thought I could trust him. It happened in a well-known street in Lerwick. There were people walking past but I was too scared to do anything, so I did what I was told. I cried but his

hand was over my mouth so it didn't make any noise. He made me do things and he did things to me. I was terrified but I couldn't do anything.

Later, my family found out and there was an investigation. I was so young that I didn't understand - it made me feel like it was my fault. He wasn't charged. He told lies about what happened.

I'm still scared to walk through the area alone because I'm terrified it's going to happen to me again. I still see him walking around and he's even tried to speak to me, like he hasn't ruined my childhood.

I still have nightmares about what he did. Every day I think about it. Every boy I am around I think they are going to do the same thing because he made me think that. I want to move on and try to be happy but seeing him walk around Shetland like he's not done anything wrong just puts me back to a bad state. I hate him for what's he's done to me.










I was pushed into a corner.

I once went out with a boy who was two years older than me. I was 14 at the time and almost every time I was alone with him he used to make me do things I didn't want. He would touch me whether I wanted him to

or not.

I was in a situation where a guy was in the position to get me very drunk. He got me so drunk I no longer had control over what was happening. I wish I had a say in it because it was my first time.

A man twice my age locked me in a room backstage at a hall and pinned me against the wall. He tried to kiss and undress me. He kept trying to stop me leaving but thankfully after some struggle I managed to


get away.

When I was 12, 16 some boys took indecent videos of me without my knowledge or consent. They played the videos in classes nearly every day until I left school. I was so humiliated that I only felt able to speak up about it a few years later. A high-up school official that I reported to said that I needed to "pull myself up" and I was "creating ghosts" in my head. People continued to share and play these videos in classes until the

end of school.








I was trying to sleep at a party and a boy was trying to come on to me. Everyone said I was lying. They said I "wanted it" because I "had shagged him before."

Boys have touched my thighs and ass without my permission so many times that I've lost count. The most severe time, a boy tried to take off my bra when he thought I was asleep. I froze and felt like I couldn't do

anything.











When I was 14 I was at a house party and a guy showed up. He was 50. He forced me to do sexual things to him and I was crying. He kept kissing me on the neck and chest.

At 14 I was sexually assaulted in a prominent place in Lerwick and later raped in every way behind a public toilet. People said that I "wanted it to happen" because I froze. They also said that, because he was a minor too, he therefore "must have been sexually abused" despite there being no evidence of this. Even though he was later charged for a similar crime, some people still make these comments about what

happened to me.


Someone tried to do stuff with me which I said I didn't want, but eventually I ended up giving in because I didn't want things to be awkward

On nights out in Shetland, I feel that groping is considered normal behaviour. I feel that if this person is, for example, a teacher, it's particularly difficult to speak up about it because a lot of people assume that they must not be dangerous; that we must be 'asking for it' if we are drunk; and believe that sexual harassment just does not happen

in Shetland.

He came up to me in the hall, took my hand and lead me into a cupboard and started kissing me. He pulled my shorts down and bent me over. He tried to get inside me but I didn't let him. He left the cupboard and rumours were quickly spread that we had sex. He went around telling everyone I was too tight for him.

a party and a guy who was a bit older than me and from a different place was all over me. He took my bag and tried to drag me outside but thankfully people stopped him.



At 14 I was
sexually assaulted by
someone over the age of 16
at three different public places
in Lerwick. Although there were
other victims and he pled guilty
to this, people in Shetland
still blamed me for
what he did.

I was 15 at the time and working in Lerwick. A man was hired who would bring sweets into work for me because he knew I liked sweet stuff. I thought he was a good friend for bringing me sweets. He would call me pet names and once he asked me to go with him to buy alcohol. I helped him to clean the store room and while I was sorting stock he all of a sudden grabbed me from

behind.

bit because I was very scared. I
called out to someone I knew

I got away.














I was 14 and in a relationship with an older boy. He raped me and didn't stop until I was in tears. He would get mad at me if I didn't want to do anything with him to the point where he would threaten to hurt me or himself. I think about it everyday and I still think it's

my fault.

When I was under the age of consent, there were men over 16 that tried to have sex with me. This seems to happen often in Shetland.

I was questioning if I was bisexual or not. I told a close friend who was also bisexual because I wanted to talk to someone about it without being judged. One day when I was with her she was hugging me a lot and she kept moving her hands low down onto my ass. I was so uncomfortable with it but I didn't see is as harassment because we were both

When I
was 12 I was
staying with family on a
run down south. Two guys
drove past me and slowed
down. They whistled at me
and shouted things at
me about my

body.

At 16, a much older man from a sports club that I went to at Clickimin was very friendly towards me. He suggested that we could meet before the class started so that he could help me improve at this sport. He kept flirting with me and touched me inappropriately over my clothes. Due to past experiences, I felt like there was no point in speaking up about it. I decided to quit that sport, which I really enjoyed, and I haven't done it

since then.

speaking to a boy, having a normal conversation. He asked me out of nowhere if I wanted a dick pic. I said no but he sent it anyway.

My boyfriend at the time wanted to meet up with me. I told him not at the moment. He kept asking and pressuring me, making me feel bad for not wanting to see him. I hadn't seen him in a while so I finally said I would meet him even though I was busy.

We were kissing and he put his hands under my clothes and tried to take my pants off. I told him no. He asked why not and I said I just don't want to. He tried again and I said no I don't want to. We kept kissing and he for some reason thought it would be fine to unzip his jeans and take his penis out and again he tried to take off my underwear. I told him no I don't want to.

He stopped for a moment and we went back to kissing, then he tried to take off my underwear again. I told him no and he got frustrated and in a mood with me. I told him I was ok with doing some sexual things but I didn't want to have sex.

He was cuddling me from behind and we were kissing and once again he took his penis out and was trying to penetrate me. He knew I didn't want this.


He kept trying over and over again to the point where I was feeling tired of it. At this point I didn't even care anymore because I felt bad for

how much he wanted to do it and didn't want him being in an even worse mood with me because that would've made the situation so much more awkward than it already was.

> He didn't use protection. This was the last time we met up.

He asked me to come back to his house after a party. I was sober when he asked and I clearly stated no. As the night went on I got drunker and he wouldn't stop pestering me. I eventually gave in and he took advantage

of me.



**Boys in** their late teens and early 20s were all over me when I was 14. It seemed like nothing important at the time but I was young and naive and they knew that.

I dated a guy 60 when I was 14, he was 18. He pressured me into sex and used to tell me he would kill himself if I left. I tried to tell people that he was bad and obsessed with the dark web. People fell out with me. Years later he got caught with child porn. "Friends" still defended him. I hate it here.

On a school trip when I was 13 I was sleeping and a boy put his hands down my trousers and up my top and felt me up. I was so scared I couldn't move. I think he thought I was still asleep.

I work in a pub and I've been followed home countless times by drunk men. One guy asked me a question and refused to leave me alone until I answered it. He pulled down his trousers and asked me to touch him. I ran away. Terrifying.

At 16, someone who I thought was my friend got me drunk and asked if I wanted to have sex with him. I kept saying no but he persisted. Eventually I said yes out of fear. I kept screaming at him to stop and tried to fight him off but he just changed position and continued. He also took the condom off during it, which I did not consent to. I didn't tell anyone for years because it wasn't as bad as things that had happened to me when I was younger so I thought that people definitely wouldn't take it seriously, and

because I had said yes to start with, I believed it was my fault.

I was 13. I made friends with a boy and he claimed he was the same age as me (he was actually 17). He started forcing me to do things I didn't want to do with him and he would manipulate me into not telling anyone.

I don't feel comfortable sharing the exact details of my story, but there's a few times where I've been taken advantage of or I've been approached and touched up when I really didn't

want to be.

I worked as a waitress and I kept getting touched by a worker. I was always too scared to tell anyone. Eventually I told one of the people who also worked there. She told me to brush it off because it was just his sense of humour.
